

Objectives:

- To disseminate information about the project: its contents, objectives, the idea behind
- To show the project website and social media
- To present the Toolkit “Cross-cultural Practices of Refugees Inclusion” in all its parts
- To collect feedbacks, opinions and suggestions on the Toolkit and how to improve it

Participants:

2 teachers and 1 tutor of the University of Venice from the Erasmus Plus Program, in London for an International Training on interculture and inclusion. They all work in highly diverse environment with different migrants’ generations.

During the meeting:

- The Uk partner, Kairos Europe, introduced the project to the participants, explaining the idea behind, the aim, the objectives, partnership and main foreseen activities. The website of the project was also presented, as well as social media that participants could explore themselves during the meeting.
- The Toolkit was presented in all its part showing an extract for each section.
- Forms were distributed in order to collect feedback and suggestions on the Toolkit.
